Having proudly served the people of Wood County as Chief Assistant Wood County Prosecutor in the Criminal Division, I, Paul Dobson, announce today that I will seek election to the position of Wood County Prosecuting Attorney. This position will be vacated at the end of next year by my supervisor, Raymond C. Fischer. I will take part in the Republican primary on March 4, 2008. I am certain this news will come as no surprise to many of you, including those who have seen me at events such as the Walbridge Autumnfest, and the Perrysburg and Bowling Green holiday parades.

I grew up in Northwest Ohio and stayed here for my education. My experience includes private practice, where I engaged in corporate and civil litigation. I started my career prosecuting in the Bowling Green Municipal Court, which handles all traffic and misdemeanor cases. I have spent over seven years in the Wood County Prosecutor's Office, which prosecutes all felony cases. Recently, I engaged in the successful prosecution of three murder cases, including the conviction of Ralph Doren for the 1991 murder of a 19 year old young woman. I am currently involved in 2 other murder cases.

The Wood County Prosecutor's Office is more than a large law firm. It is the only office in the county charged with the duty to prosecute felony crimes. The citizens of Wood County have the right to demand that the County Prosecutor have the experience and proven track record to prosecute violent felons and seek justice for victims. The dangerous, violent and damaging criminals, internet predators and drug-related offenders I have brought to justice make up my resume. I pledge to carry that experience and commitment into the full leadership of the prosecutor's office.

As Chief Assistant, I supervise the largest division within the office. I have participated in the selection, training and supervision of Assistant Prosecutors and support staff. I have consulted on and examined budgetary and personnel concerns and helped develop plans for the future of the office. Further, engaging in corporate litigation has provided me with the experience that county officials, township trustees and the other clients of the civil division can count on.

Wood County citizens need to feel safe at work, in their homes and on the streets. Former Wood County Prosecuting Attorney Alan Mayberry first taught me that these citizens are best served through my vigorous, tenacious prosecution of felony offenders. I pledge to continue that principle and seek new improvements in all areas of the office so that the citizens of this county, as well as the members of the more than 15 police agencies who protect them, can be confident in the high standard they have come to expect from me.

Because I have the right experience, I ask for your support in 2008 as I make my bid for the office of Wood County Prosecuting Attorney.
